From The Presidents Desk



If good things come to those that wait, then the crane industry is well overdue for some good news and I'm pleased to be able to share exactly that in this newsletter. On May 6th the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) was finally able to release a National Class 1 SPV notice allowing Articulated Cranes, Truck Cranes and All Terrain Cranes up to 3 axles to operate without permits on approved routes under a notice of

authority which is valid for 5 years. Note the words "on approved routes", these approved routes have largely carried over from the old permitting system, which means

under the SPV1 notice we are definitely no worse off, but the lack of local government approved roads still exists. The reality is our old permit system has always required separate approval for local government roads. The NHVR and CICA is actively working to address this issue, some states have added additional local government roads to their maps. As a side note unfortunately Queensland chose not to adopt this for 3 axle All Terrain Cranes, however I'm sure you will agree overall this is a great win for our industry and one that is well overdue. CICA is not going to sit back and accept Qld's decision and on the 5th of May we met with the Qld Minister for Transport and Commonwealth Games, Hon Stirling Hinchliffe, and NHVR CEO, Sal Petrocetto, to discuss this inconsistency and also the other challenges we face which are unique to Qld. CICA is not going to stop at the Class 1 SPV notice. As this article goes to print CICA's industry reference group is meeting with the Federal Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, the Hon Darren Chester MP and Sal to discuss the inconsistencies and challenges we face across states, the safety implications this can place on our road network and the cost burden to industry.

On May 11th CAWA held a special general meeting to vote to officially become part of the National CICA body. I say officially as CICA and CAWA have had a reciprocal memorandum of agreement in place since we began the one association project. I'm very pleased to announce the members agreed this is the way forward with an overwhelmingly positive vote. CICA is a great industry association and without a doubt the state associations have built the foundations of CICA's strength today. For CAWA, in particular at this time, I would like to acknowledge those volunteers both past and present (I won't mention all the names, but you know who you are) who have shown the dedication and leadership to make WA such a strong industry group and who have also helped build the national body. Come 1st January 2017 when CAWA merges with CICA, as it has been for the other states, it will be business as usual, excepting WA will now benefit from the financial and team resources of the CICA office.

Back in April some of us Aussie's headed to Munich to the world's largest construction fair – Bauma, albeit without the traditional CICA Bauma tour, maybe next time? For those who were fortunate enough to attend, it certainly didn't disappoint. Being a manufacturer, I could boast at some of the technology advances on the Demag/Terex display - but I guess I'll let others give an unbiased rundown of all the latest and greatest in the world of cranes. For CICA it was a great opportunity to connect with like industry bodies. Just prior to Bauma, CICA met with the main stakeholders of Federation of Equipment Manufacturers (FEM) Mobile Crane Committee to discuss Major Inspections. Make sure you have a read of Brandon's article in this month's newsletter, I'm sure you will agree this is moving in the right direction.

During Bauma, CICA participated in the International Crane Stakeholder Assembly (ICSA) meeting. ICSA is a unique assembly of like associations from around the world – Association of Equipment Manufacturers (AEM), The European Association of Abnormal Road Transport and Mobile Cranes (ESTA), Specialized Carriers & Rigging Association (SC&RA), FEM and CICA. The meeting is split into two groups Users and Manufacturers for the morning session, then both groups are combined for the afternoon. Three Guidance documents were approved for release during the meetings:

- Guidance - Leaving mobile cranes unattended
- Guidance - Lifting A Load With Several Mobile Cranes (Multiple Crane or Tandem Lifting)
- Guidance - Lifting of Persons with Mobile Cranes

COULD YOUR COMPANY BE ELIGIBLE FOR PAYROLL TAX EXEMPTIONS?

A Report by the CEO



With the election 4 weeks away I thought it appropriate to reference a classic comedy routine by Abbott and Castello.

The Who's on First, What's on Second, and I Don't Know on Third script is one of the most famous by the comedy duo. The pair go back and forth with Lou Castello asking the questions while unknowingly giving the answer to his own question. Around in circles they go as Bud Abbott doesn't understand why Castello keeps asking the same question. Eventually, Castello surrenders with "I don't even know what I'm talking about."



That state of frustration and confusion is often where crane companies end up when trying to supply Safe Work Method Statements to clients. The level of work and rework of the SWMS to contort it into a document that meets the site requirements for formatting leaves the crane company surrendering with a comment "I don't even know what I'm talking about." The result is a document that the crane crew is unfamiliar with and less likely to use for reference. Rather, SWMS for the work of lifting should be left to a familiar format where content can be easily referenced and reviewed when needed.

This theme of standardised site documents has been the focus of the CICA Standardised Document Project. Many members have supplied CICA with samples of SWMS, Lift Equipment Registers, Lift Plans, and Daily Checklists and with the assistance of the CICA Technical Committee we are nearly completed with a proposed standard for simple lift plan, detailed lift plan, daily checklist, equipment register, slewing crane SWMS, and articulated crane SWMS. The next stage is to work with the Australian Constructor Association (ACA) Safety Working Group to approve the standardised document format that would ideally make it more straight forward for crane companies to prepare these documents instead of changing the documents to cater to the preference of a site. Please continue to stay tuned.

If Safe Work Method Statements are one example of a topic with high variability, Major Inspections are another. The week before BAUMA this year CICA was able to meet with engineering leaders from Liebherr, Manitowoc, Tadano, and Terex to discuss the manufacturer's support of a continuous monitoring approach to machine condition rather than the 10-year in-service approach more commonly applied. These leaders represent the Federation of Equipment Manufacturers (FEM) Mobile Crane Sector. The attendance by all four manufacturers at such a busy time leading up to BAUMA showed the importance that manufacturers are placing on this topic. You may recall the most popular presentation at the 2015 CICA conference by Mr. Hans-Dieter Willim on metal fatigue and how crane usage variability is very difficult to link a design life with a calendar age. We also held member meetings in November to discuss CICA's revised Major Inspection position paper. Through the discussion in Germany we sought to understand what is done throughout other areas of Europe and in particular, Germany, where the cranes are designed and where our original idea of a specialist assessment at an interval of 4years, 8years, and 12years originated from. CICA also demonstrated to the manufacturers advancements that we have made with the CraneSafe program now that it is an electronic application with the ability to add photos and highlight areas for monitoring.

The meeting took an unexpected turn during discussions about the CraneSafe program. The manufacturers didn't realise that this level of inspection is being completed year-over-year by 3rd party independent inspectors and that the record keeping is available for cranes that have repeatedly used the CraneSafe program.

As a result, the manufacturers and CICA are going to continue discussions on how the CraneSafe program could be used as a mechanism for continuous monitoring of the crane with adequate record keeping that would provide information throughout the life of the crane. In the middle of June CICA will meet again via teleconference with the FEM members to review in more detail the information that is included in the CraneSafe assessment.

If industry is going to utilise the condition monitoring approach to assess their cranes then record keeping of maintenance, servicing, and repairs will be paramount. Record keeping not only shows what components have been replaced through the course of the crane's usage, but it demonstrates that there is a process that is in use by crane companies that will keep cranes in a safe working condition.

These maintenance records and CraneSafe inspections will also benefit industry as state road enforcement starts looking at roadworthiness of mobile cranes under the umbrella of Chain of Responsibility. This will begin to be rolled out in 2017 and 2018.
